

Standardized Incident-based Tables

The following table shells were created by the Bureau of Justice Statistics (BJS) to assist in the development and presentation of incident-based crime data. In the past year, BJS conducted a review of crime data requests made to the South Carolina State Law Enforcement Division (SLED). This review provided insight into the nature and types of criminal information requested. In addition, BJS examined publications from State statistical agencies to gain an improved understanding of how incident-based statistics are presented across the Nation. Based on these evaluations and on the recommendations from the law enforcement community and other criminal justice representatives, 21 tables were identified as measures that could provide policy-relevant criminal information. It should be noted that these table shells are not final and feedback on the usefulness of these and other recommended tables is encouraged. We hope to promote comparability across jurisdictions by identifying standardized incident-based tables easily replicable by any jurisdiction.
